- **Class Options** has a variety of settings that can be adjusted, including:
  - **Student Activity Notifications:** Instructors can stay informed of student progress by editing these settings. In this example, the instructor will be sent a message automatically once students reach 90% mastery of the class material.
  - **Learning Options:** This section allows instructors to modify the various learning options available to their students (*New Student Module only*).
  - **Parent Notification:** This is a great way to keep parents and guardians informed of student progress in ALEKS. Instructors can enable automatic emails to be sent weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly on specific days of the week.
  - **Worksheet Options:** Instructors can adjust how worksheets are generated for students. By default there are 16 review questions, but instructors can choose to include 12 Review questions + 4 Ready to Learn questions instead or select their own combination of questions for up to 30 questions (20 Review questions, 10 Ready to Learn).

## Class Duplicate Settings
