ALEKS is currently being used in our school to supplement instruction. We are a University Model School where students take classes on campus and have home instruction as well. We have offered ALEKS for any student who wants additional instruction/practice in math. Our math courses are one year ahead of the typical grade level, so students transferring in often are behind their grade. ALEKS is used to help those students advance over the summer prior to the new school year. We have had great success with students building their math skills, and many students are renewing their subscriptions from last year. I would say this is evidence that the students and parents find it beneficial.
