## Scenario

**How many days per week is class time dedicated to ALEKS?**

1 day per week.

**What is the average length of a class period when ALEKS is used?**

45 minutes.

## Implementation

**How do you implement ALEKS?**

**How do you structure your class period with ALEKS?**
